TXU-VFL matches provide high quality football.

ast weekend's matches highlighted the high standard of the TXU-VFL competition and also gave us a chance to reflect on our journey over recent years.

Both our aligned and stand-alone clubs (Frankston, North Ballarat and Tasmania) are playing good football.

No one could have asked for a better ABC television match than the North Ballarat-Geelong clash, which saw the Roosters emerge victorious after an enthralling dual. It was a great advertisement for the competition.

Our players are now presenting a weekly brand of football that is the strongest outside the AFL.

It's hoped that supporters continue to attend and enjoy top-class football.

It's important for members or regular attendees to spread the good word about the TXU-VFL so others too will be encouraged to witness great games each week.

If attendances don't rise, it won't be a result of the quality of the football. People may have legitimate reasons for not attending games, but to say it's because of the standard of football just doesn't stand up.

Another strong indicator of the evolving nature of the competition is the number of young people playing.

Remarkably, for the under-22 curtain raiser to next month's Victoria-South Australia match, some 72 per cent of TXU-VFL players are eligible for selection.

Equally significant is that players are remaining with TXU-VFL clubs and posting significant milestones. Troy West this week becomes the owner of Williamstown's games played record. It is an outstanding performance, given the long and proud history of the club.

Others including Daniel Clarke (150 games this weekend) are also posting significant milestones, while Chad Liddell, Nick Carter and Travis Robertson, are also heading towards 100 games.

I'm sure their success and recognition will encourage others to match or even better their feats.

Last weekend also saw the unusual circumstance of a player being ordered off. It is the second time this has happened in the TXU-VFL in the past four years.

Every major competition in Victoria has an orderoff rule, which is reserved for what umpires deem a serious breach of the rules.

Several years ago the laws of the game committee modified the rule to abolish the 15-minute cooling off period for a player sent from the ground. Now, once a player is ordered off he can't return.

Players who are ordered off must face the VFL Tribunal. There is no automatic penalty for a player. The order-off rule applies in all states but not in the AFL, which has its own series of control mechanisms to monitor on-field behaviour.

The TXU-VFL doesn't have the luxury of multiple television cameras at each game to capture incidents. We have to rely on and support the umpire's judgement, and then let the VFL Tribunal make a determination.

Have a good TXU-VFL weekend.

Ben's a great catch

Ben Robbins is happy to be at Port.

t doesn't seem so long ago that the VFA/VFL was overflowing with former AFL players.

The competition was a natural haven for those whose distinguished AFL careers had come to an end, and others who had been delisted after several seasons at the elite level.

It was a given that every club would have at least one ex-AFL player, while others including clubs with bigger cheque books, could afford half a dozen or more.

Those days are well and truly gone. For a number of reasons, ex-AFL players are no longer readily found in large numbers in the TXU-VFL competition.

Firstly, 10 TXU-VFL clubs affiliated with AFL clubs feature AFL players and rookies on a weekly basis.

Certainly, the considerable remuneration packages afforded to AFL players can't be matched by TXU-VFL clubs, which have salary restrictions that weren't in place a decade ago.

Also, players are staying in the AFL until their playing days are virtually done, whereas in the past, especially from 1960-90, they headed to the VFA in their late 20s.

Interstate clubs, which don't have the same financial restrictions, are able to offer more money to ex-AFL players prepared to leave Victoria.

So, it is quite a feat for a TXU-VFL club to land an experienced ex-AFL player, especially one with over five years at the top level.


Port Melbourne was delighted that Ben Robbins, a 'pseudo' Port player over the past two years, agreed to stay with the Borough when the Kangaroos delisted him at the end of 2004.

Robbins was one of the first players new coach Saade Ghazi spoke to when Robbins' 92-game AFL career ended.

Unlike other ex-AFL players, Robbins proved to be a straight-forward 'catch'. The other bonus is that Port knows it is getting a bona fide 'goer' each week.

"He was one of the easiest recruits to sign," Ghazi said.

"The first question I asked him was, 'Did he want to play at a good standard?' and he said he did. Then I



asked him if he wanted to come to Port Melbourne and

"I spoke to our management about finances and the deal was done and dusted."

Robbins created a favourable impression with the Borough faithful last season when he played all 21 games, including the TXU-VFL Grand Final.

Ghazi said Robbins enjoyed the environment at Port Melbourne and was only too happy to stay on in 2005.

"He's a great fellow and really good to have around the club," Ghazi said.

"I think Ben knew last year that he wasn't going to play at AFL level again unless there were a few injuries at the Kangaroos.

"He knew that, but his attitude was tremendous. I reckon last year he took on board that he was a Port Melbourne player to some degree."

Port Melbourne can rightfully claim Ben Robbins as one of its own.



West sets new mark

The Seagulls' veteran is proud of his efforts.

roy West is this weekend due to re-write one of the most enduring records in Williamstown Football Club's annals.

West, 33, is set to play his 206th game for the Seagulls and will become the owner of the 121-year-old club's games played record.

The long serving former club captain will overtake club legend Ray Smith, whose 205 games has stood as a club record since 1961.

Several players – Tony Pastore (189), Tom Russell (200) and Saade Ghazi (204) - all came close only to fall short.

It has been left to West, who played his first game in the famous Williamstown colours in 1993 against Oakleigh at Warrawee Park, to claim sole ownership.

While West is sketchy on many of the details from that game – he thinks he played on a back flank alongside 'Ghost' Howlett, with Simon Lloyd, elder brother of Williamstown captain Brad and Essendon superstar Matthew, at full back - he has a bag full of great memories. None is greater than 2003, when West co-captained the Seagulls' first premiership since 1990.

To be etched in the VFL record books as the Williamstown games holder is something West considers special.

"It is a massive honour and it means a fair bit to me,"

"I have always been fairly realistic with my ability as a footballer. I was never going to be one to rack up individual awards like best and fairests.

"I guess I set out to have a long and lasting career at Williamstown Football Club," he said.

Not too many seasons have past without some fan reminding West that he's not a patch of his brother Scott, the Western Bulldog star. But it doesn't upset him. Although the two are completely different, West has nothing but admiration for Scott, who has won six best and fairest awards for the Bulldogs.

"It's a statement of fact. He's played 250-plus games of AFL football and I've played 200 games of VFL football," West said.

"I'm proud of what he's done, (but) I'm sure he wouldn't mind giving up a couple of his best and fairest awards to play in a premiership."



West went through an extensive pre-season before declaring himself right to play his 12th year with Williamstown. He rates the pre-season as one of the best he's done.

He said his desire to play another season wasn't solely fuelled by his desire to claim the club record, but it was a factor.

"I would be lying if I said the record wasn't something I was thinking about," West said. "I wish I had knocked it over last year so it wouldn't have been a big issue."

As the milestone drew nearer, West remained hesitant about finally claiming it from Smith.

He recalled a recent conversation with a friend, where he said that if his career total was 205, he would be just as happy as he will be claiming it outright.

West said he has been disappointed with his and the team's start to the season. "Obviously, we have been pretty badly beaten in our first two games and everyone's position is up for grabs. No one is guaranteed a spot," he said.





As his journey at Point Gellibrand has continued, West has taken it upon himself to learn more about the remarkable history of this proud and traditional club.

He has been ensuring that players, including those at AFL partner Collingwood, are well aware of the club's rich history.

"We have tried to get as many of the past players involved as possible," West said.

"Many of the guys come back to the club on initiation day and that's great.

"Last year was the 50th anniversary of the 1954

Williamstown premiership team and it was great to see all those players come back."

West is well versed on Smith – an honest, tough rover or half-forward – and the role he played in tandem with Gerry 'Monster' Callahan in the club's halcyon days, when they played in six Grand Finals from 1953-60 and won five

"It's impossible to compare different eras, but to have played the most number of games for the third oldest club in the game is something I'll cherish for the rest of my life," West said.

Smith happy to pass the baton

ay Smith might be about to lose his games record at Williamstown, but he hasn't lost his sense of

When reminded that Troy West is set to claim the honour outright, Smith joked: "I still have a contract out on him."

Smith laughs that his "contract" had the desired effect on Tom Russell (200 games) and Saade Ghazi (204).

It's a record Smith's owned since 1961, when his 11season stay at Williamstown came to an end.

"Records are made to be broken. Tommy Russell got close and so did Saade and now Troy is about to do it and that's great," Smith said.

"I have been proud to hold it, but I'm sure Troy will carry it with pride.

"He has proven himself, been a very good representative for the club and he's been up there in performance. He is worthy of the honour," he said.

Now in his early 70s, Smith only sees Williamstown play a couple of games a season, but it hasn't dulled his love for the club.

He described his time at Williamstown as "the best time I've ever put in", enabling him to make several lasting friendships.

"I didn't know a soul when I went there. It was a great club, they were great for me."

In the latter part of his playing career, Smith helped shape the rules for the players. One stipulated that if you didn't train, then you didn't play.

Ultimately, it brought an end to his playing career. "I helped make the rules and then I changed jobs and

I couldn't train. I couldn't be the first one to break the rules so I had to move on," he said.

Smith retired from Williamstown aged 28. He played a further four seasons with Cora Lyn.

One can only wonder if his record would have been beaten if he hadn't introduced those rules!

Repaying the faith

Frankston's Daniel Clarke reaches a key milestone.

aniel Clarke isn't one to spend too much time looking in football's rear-view mirror. Clarke, who this weekend is due to play his 150th game for Frankston, one of only a handful to reach the milestone at the club, prefers to concentrate on what's at hand. He likes what he sees with the Dolphins.

The 31-year-old, now in his 10th season on the Peninsula, has ridden the Dolphin roller coaster more than most.

He's played in two losing Grand Finals; played finals in five of the first six years he was at the club and seen literally hundreds, including some big name ex-AFL players, pull on the Frankston jumper.

Surprisingly, Clarke rates the past few years – when the Dolphins have missed the finals - as his most enjoyable.

"I really love playing at the club, especially the past couple of years. It has been an enjoyable time with the current coaching set-up and the way we have recruited," Clarke said.

One of the motivations for stretching his VFL career into a 10th year was his belief Frankston is not too far away from getting it right and returning to the finals.

He thinks it would be a greater achievement, given the way the competition is now set up, than when Frankston was runner-up in 1996 and 1997.

"I would love for Frankston to be back up there, a contender again before I leave the club," he said.

Each October, Clarke's phone rings hot with suburban clubs asking him to take on a captain-coach's role.

Asked why he has stuck around so long, Clarke simply said he is repaying the loyalty Frankston

powerbroker Bryan Mace and the committee have

He's had to battle through several back and soft tissue injuries, but he credits fitness advisor Rob Railton and chiropractor Kim Kennedy for getting him in the best possible shape.

"A few years ago my future was pretty much up in the air because I had a lot of injuries that I wasn't getting right," he said.

"Now thanks to Rob and Kim, I've been able to get the solid fitness base you need before you enter a season.

"I'm proud to have played that length of time at this football club."

Clarke did not play a senior game during the three years he spent at Melbourne after the Demons selected him with pick 54 in 1992. Not succeeding at AFL level remains his biggest football regret.

But Clarke said the way the TXU-VFL has evolved, he faces the weekly challenge of playing against quality opposition, many of whom are rising AFL stars.

"It's one of the real beauties of the competition – you get to play against some of the players destined for the big time," Clarke said.

"When you look back at some games, you remember the guys who have gone on to the AFL and you realise they were guys you played well against. It's something you can hang your hat on."

Perseverance pays off

Matt Gadsden confirms his place.

lootball requires many things to succeed: patience, persistence and playing time are just a few of the pre-requisites.

Sandringham's Matt Gadsden will readily vouch that you need all the above. He only has to point to his own fledgling career as evidence.

As he entered 2004, his third at the Zebras, Gadsden's game total stood at two. There had been times when he could not get a game in the reserves.

"There were times when I thought I would leave the club," Gadsden said.

"There were a lot of trying times. When I wasn't getting a game in the reserves, it was really tough.

"It really makes you think about where you want to go with your football. The year that I missed out on the twos I stuck at it when a lot of other guys left," he said.

"I could see that if I could swallow my pride and stay on, the opportunities might be there at the end of the

Gadsden's patience and perseverance paid off when he was picked for a couple of senior games towards the end of 2003.

It spurred him on to remain at Trevor Barker Oval in 2004, which coincided with Mark Williams taking over as coach.

He was able to put in a full pre-season, something a shoulder reconstruction had prevented him from doing the previous year.

But although he started the year promisingly, injury stopped that momentum. He didn't lose faith, knowing that if he continued to work hard he could still force his way into the seniors.

Fast forward to the tail end of last season. Gadsden's game tally had crept up, but it was still shy of double figures when the VFL announced its '12-10' finals rule, which stipulated aligned teams must have no more than 12 AFL players and no fewer than 10 VFL players.

Gadsden would like to think his form warranted selection, not the rule change, but either way, he found himself in Sandringham's team at the right time of the

He more than held his own to consolidate a place in the team that defeated Port Melbourne in last year's TXU-VFL Grand Final.



"I benefited from it. I got my chance and clasped it with both hands," Gadsden said.

"It was fantastic for me. I got my foot in the door and I was able to keep my spot after that."

Gadsden started 2005 in the seniors. Again he believes it is his form, and not the fact that he was a member of the premiership team, that got him there.

While all that patience, perseverance and, more recently playing time, has paid off, Gadsden realises he can ill afford to take his foot off the pedal.

"It's just a matter of playing well week-to-week and keeping my spot," he said.



Leading from the front

aking over as captain of the Northern Bullants was something he never thought about, but Frankie Raso is relishing the added responsibility of leading the club.

When Brett Zorzi, last season's captain and best and fairest, decided to move to South Australia, the Bullants were left without a leader.

Coach Barry Mitchell said the decision to appoint Raso was a relatively easy one.

"I suppose Brett's shoes are big ones to fill. He was a terrific player last season and a good captain," Mitchell said.

"But Frank leads from the front with his aggression at the ball and his aggression at the man with the ball.

"It is the style of leadership we want to show the younger players."

Raso described his elevation to the club captaincy as a "big honour."

He said having Zorzi as captain last year provided him with a good learning experience as he pushed up into the leadership group.

The transition is something that Raso said was another step along his football journey.

"One minute you are a kid starting out and the next minute you are helping the kids," Raso said.

"There's a lot more responsibility on your shoulders, you don't realise it until you get there.

"At training you have to go out and show other players what to do, make sure you do all the extra stuff so everyone at the club can see it," he said.

"You have to lead by example in every little aspect of the game."

Raso started the season free of injury, a bonus after he missed most of last year.

After being unable to shake off persistent pain in his wrist, x-rays revealed he had, in fact, broken the scaphoid bone. Most concerning was the fact the doctor was unable to tell how long Raso had carried the injury.

"Playing football you are always sore, but this ended up being particularly sore," he said.



Raso required a bone graft from his hip, which impacted on his greatest asset – his running ability.

Doctors cautioned Raso about returning too soon, but he was going stir crazy on the sidelines.

Fortunately, he didn't suffer any long-term damage, and he is in top shape and raring to go.

He said the Bullants' list had improved, Carlton's list was also better and all the indicators were positive.

"All the young kids are enthusiastic and excited and they bring that to training," he said.

"It brings a little bit of flair, a little bit of excitement. It's always a good sign."

For Frankie Raso, captain of the Bullants, all the indicators are positive.





A more mature approach

New Devil Luke Shackleton is a realist.

hen he left Tasmania not long following his 18th birthday to join Collingwood, Luke Shackleton must have wondered if he would ever play football again in his home state.

After all, Shackleton was fresh off a Morrish Medal win as the best player in the TAC Cup competition and the Magpies had used their second choice to draft him. There was every reason to think he had many, many years ahead of him in the AFL.

Sometimes, however, things don't pan out as expected. During his two years with Collingwood, Shackleton managed just one AFL game - in round 18 last year.

He pretty much knew then that his time with Collingwood was probably up.

Shackleton said he was one of about five or six players the club needed to make decisions about. "I prepared myself either way," Shackleton said.

"If I had stayed I would have gone even harder, (but) I prepared myself knowing that I wanted to play at the next highest level, which is obviously the TXU-VFL."

After the season concluded, Shackleton's worst fears were realised. He was one of the players Collingwood delisted - just before his 20th birthday.

Melbourne offered him some hope when he was invited to do pre-season training with the Demons. He enjoyed his time there and thought he was in the running to be selected in the NAB AFL Pre-season Draft.

But two days before the draft, the Demons told him they intended to take two tall players and were unsure what to do with their third pick.

"That more or less put me out of the equation, but it was a good experience training there," Shackleton said.

Shackleton was swamped with offers from South Australia. Western Australia and even clubs from the Diamond Valley, as well as TXU-VFL club Tasmania.

Devils' football manager Trent Bartlett said the club prioritised any Tasmanian player who had been delisted by AFL clubs.

"Luke spoke to a number of clubs, but the lure of playing at home was a factor that certainly helped us," Bartlett said.

Shackleton said the idea of playing at home near family and friends and with players he was familiar with clinched the deal.



While six months shy of his 21st birthday, Shackleton has fast developed a realistic and mature approach. He's not putting pressure on himself to have a season outof-the box in the hope of being snapped up by an AFL club.

"Not too many people get a second chance," Shackleton said.

"I'm now playing different roles than I did previously. I've been up forward, thrown down back a couple of times and had stints in the midfield.

"I suppose if I have a good year, anything can happen," he said.

That is certainly the case in football.

imon Rosa can remember the bad old days for Bendigo. In fact, Rosa was involved in dishing out some of the pain. As a top-up player for Carlton's VFL team in 2002, Rosa helped inflict a hefty defeat of more than 20 goals on the hapless Bendigo, then known as the Diggers. That Optus Oval loss was part of Bendigo's 35-game losing streak.

Thankfully, those days are now well behind the club, which has this season jumped from the blocks to post 22 and 19-goal scorelines in the first two games.

For Rosa, a graduate of the Bendigo Pioneers in the TAC Cup, the club's good early-season form makes his decision to return home all the more satisfying.

Now in his third season with the Bendigo Bombers, Rosa recently racked up his 50th TXU-VFL game in a career that seems to have flown by.

He acknowledges the club's alignment with Essendon was a factor in his decision to move back to Bendigo.

For the first time in several years, he hasn't been troubled by osteitis pubis, allowing him to complete a full pre-season.

It has paid dividends, with Rosa muscling out club captain and triple best and fairest winner Nick Carter from a starting on-ball role.

"I always knew that if I was fit enough I could play in the midfield. I had a good pre-season and an opportunity presented itself. I tried to grab it with both hands," Rosa said.

"Nick (Carter) and I seem to be swapping with each other on the ball. It's working well."

Rosa credits the club's fitness staff and new coach Matthew Knights for the positive start. He said Knights has instilled the strong work ethic he showed during his years at Richmond into the team.

"He was a midfielder, so he likes a running game and he likes the guys to be super-fit," Rosa said.

"There is a big emphasis in fitness and work rate. It has been great so far."

While the Bombers climbed into their first finals series last year, Rosa said everyone concerned was



disappointed the club lost in the first week of the finals.

Rosa said no one was satisfied with that performance, with everyone making a commitment towards a better showing in 2005.

He said the atmosphere has been bubbly since preseason. Having a reserves team in the competition has also buoyed the club.

"There are twice as many guys around the club. There's a lot more depth, and more guys pushing for selection, so there's a lot more pressure on. That's a positive for the club," he said.

"This year we know we have a pretty handy team. The boys are committed to having a crack and we really want to do well," he said.

"We're looking at a top four finish."

Bendigo certainly has come a long way from the dark days of 2002, thanks in part to Simon Rosa.



Bendigo to break its duck

The regional rivals feature in the weekend's best match.

ver many, many years the towns of Bendigo and Ballarat have enjoyed a healthy rivalry in just about anything you care to imagine.

That competitive spirit lifts more than a notch or two when the two meet on the football field.

The two have played in many fierce encounters over the decades, but since joining the TXU-VFL, bragging rights have been held exclusively by North Ballarat.

As the Bendigo Bombers prepare to host North Ballarat in this weekend's match-of-the-round, the Bombers hope to bury their last remaining demon against the old enemy.

North Ballarat is the only team Bendigo has not defeated since it joined the VFL in 1998. The Roosters have been left to crow in all nine meetings.

But, Bendigo's 2005 team is vastly different to the squads North Ballarat has previously encountered.

New coach Matthew Knights has the Bombers playing an attacking, aggressive style, which has seen them kick 22 and 19 goals in their first two matches against the Coburg Tigers and the Box Hill Hawks respectively.

Bendigo had the bye last weekend, while North Ballarat emerged from an enthralling, high-quality game against Geelong with an impressive 32-point win.

After dropping the season opener at home, the Roosters have rebounded with two strong performances.

It provides an interesting backdrop to what promises to be a match with more at stake than just the four points. Bendigo, however, can finally get on the board against its old foe.

On top of having a new name, the Scorpions have also re-discovered their winning ways in a spectacular start to the season.

After winning just three matches in 2004, the Scorpions head to Point Gellibrand unbeaten after three games and sitting on top of the TXU-VFL ladder.

It's a different story for the Seagulls, who've had a week to re-group after a 15-goal belting from Werribee.



There's no doubt Brad Gotch will have the Seagulls primed for an improved performance, but it's still hard to see them toppling the Scorpions.

Sandringham has found some winning form after an inglorious performance in the season opener, but it will need to be on its guard against a talented Geelong.

The Zebras will have to do without full-forward Nick Sautner, who broke his thumb last weekend and is expected to miss several weeks. Whoever replaces him will have to contend with Matthew Egan, last season's full-back in the TXU-VFL Team of the Year. It should be close, but Sandringham can sneak home.

Now that Port Melbourne is on the board, look for it to gain some much needed momentum at the expense of the Northern Bullants in the 158th meeting between these two traditional rivals.

Tasmania faces a must-win game against Frankston at Bellerive Oval. If the Devils drop their fourth successive match they can forget about the finals. Look for Tasmania to post its first win of the season.

The Coburg Tigers caused the Box Hill Hawks all sorts of problems last season winning both their matches, but the Tigers have struggled this season. The Hawks can extend Coburg's losing streak.


